

# Associate Healthcare Scientist – The Journey so far.....

Within the Vascular Investigations Unit at Coventry, we have seen a steady increase in the number of referrals, particularly for the less specialised tests such as ABPIs, exercise tests and toe pressures.

To cope with this demand an existing member of our team in a level 4 position was trained up 'in-house' and signed off locally as being competent. However, time and quality of training given by senior team members was limited due to departmental pressures. So, when we saw how the Clinical Vascular Science Associate role had been introduced at Manchester Royal Infirmary, we jumped at the opportunity to get our colleague involved. Furthermore, this September will see Brenda amongst the first cohort of students to commence with the new Level 6 Healthcare Science Partitioner Apprenticeship (Vascular Science) BSc at the University of Gloucestershire. Upon completion of this 3-year degree Brenda will also be able to add DVT, AAA, and Carotid scanning to her repertoire, making her even more invaluable to the department!

There were certainly some challenges with the level 4 programme and getting Brenda to this stage, but it is fantastic to see her progress along this pathway and be amongst the first to do so in the country for our specialism, and I would encourage others to consider this pathway for their services.

November last year. The course was fully funded by the apprenticeship scheme, and on completion has meant Brenda has obtained a formal qualification as an Associate Healthcare Scientist and AHCS Associate registration.

Brenda is an extremely valued member of the team, who along with her now increased clinical duties, also takes charge of all administrative duties for the department. Being able to utilise her clinical expertise for these tests has had a significant impact upon department waiting times and relieved the pressure on senior members of the team to perform more specialised scans and even allow for regular time away from scanning.


## Welcome to the SVT Quarterly Newsletter

### The SVT Research Committee is pleased to announce the new window for **SVT Research Grant** applications is **NOW OPEN** and will run until 29/09/23.

Additionally, for the first time we are also welcoming applications to our new SVT Grant Writing Award.

We understand through feedback from SVT members that clinical commitments in the workplace often restrict the ability to perform or even begin a research project, despite the many good ideas out there! Applying for research grants is very time-consuming. We would like to address this, at least in part, by providing small 'writing grants' as part of the SVT Grants programme. This will be to a maximum of £500 which we envisage will allow departments to backfill staff for a temporary period, or otherwise free members from clinical duties, enabling them to have the 'space' to formulate and write a research grant application. Research proposals are expected to have already been broadly planned, discussed and accepted by managers/supervisors who are in agreement that, where relevant, backfilling is appropriate and feasible. Applications are welcomed for a writing grant of up to £500 and may be submitted using the appropriate **Writing Grant application form.** This is a simple one page form, available <u>HERE</u>.

### REMINDER: Update your CPD profile by the end of the membership year (31<sup>st</sup> of August 2023)

CPD is an important part of maintaining your AVS accreditation. Accredited members of the SVT are required to maintain a rolling average of 30 points over any 3-year membership period. Membership years run from the 1<sup>st</sup> of September to the 31<sup>st</sup> of August each year.

The Education Committee recommend aiming to accrue approximately 10 points per year. We understand that many of you may only be able to attend a conference once every few years, which is why we now ask for 30 points over any 3-year period.

Each year the CPD team audit 10% of members to ensure that activity uploaded is accurate and complete. Members included in this membership years audit will be contacted at the start of July.

All members with less than 30 points on the 1<sup>st</sup> of September 2023 will be contacted and risk their AVS lapsing. Please take some time to update your locker before the end of the membership year.

Please ensure your contact details are up to date as the CPD team will use the e-mail address provided in your locker to contact you.

## A call for BMUS workshop speakers / demonstrators.


The 54th annual BMUS conference is at York Racecourse December  $5^{\text{th}} - 7^{\text{th}}$ .

We are currently looking for a volunteer to take on the role of Newsletter Editor


For this role we ask is that you are an accredited member of the SVT and that your CPD is up to date. As part of this role, you will be responsible for
